EU Regional Project Paves the Way for Successful Geographical Indications Systems in Central Asia

Almaty, 5 October 2012 - An international forum "Increasing recognizability of Central Asia as a supplier of high-quality and unique agricultural produce, creating favourable conditions for successful systems of Geographical Indications" was held in Almaty, Kazakhstan.

One of the sub-components of the activities of the international consortium "CANDY V" is aimed at strengthening the capacity of groups of producers, processors, exporters, experts, and consultants in Central Asian countries in the field of product promotion, increase recognisability and image of the Central Asian countries through the application of Geographical Indications (https://www.wipo.int/geo_indications/en/). A number of activities were carried out within the framework of the project to initiate and pilot the introduction of products with the potential of Geographical Indications, the quality and characteristics of which are determined by their place of origin, local traditions of production methods and specific properties associated with certain territories and their heritage in Tajikistan, Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan and Kyrgyzstan.

UNDP's regional project 'Aid for Trade in Central Asia' as part of its work to increase MSME's competitiveness implements activities to advance the Geographical Indications in Central Asian region for increased recognition of Central Asian GIs by consumers in relevant markets and improved market access.

The participants of the forum from Austria, Tajikistan, Kyrgyzstan, Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, France and Switzerland jointly summed up the results of the activities implemented over the previous two and a half years and identified further joint actions to promote and develop Geographical Indication systems in Central Asia.

Experts from EU countries representatives of the ministries of agriculture, ministries of economy and trade, national patent offices, tourism development agencies, manufacturers, processors, food exporters, representatives of local and international organizations operating in Central Asia attended the forum.

The event was organized by the "CANDY V" consortium led by the international Austrian organization Hilfswerk International within the framework of the project "Regional Integration and Capacity Building to Boost Agribusiness MSMEs Competitiveness and Trade Promotion in Central Asia", funded by the European Union program "Central Asia - Invest V" and the Austrian Agency Development, jointly with UNDP's 'Aid for Trade in Central Asia' project funded by the Government of Finland.

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The European Union is made up of 27 Member States who have decided to gradually link together their know-how, resources and destinies. Together, during a period of enlargement of 50 years, they have built a zone of stability, democracy and sustainable development whilst maintaining cultural diversity, tolerance and individual freedoms.
